At the end of each of the 6 weeks:

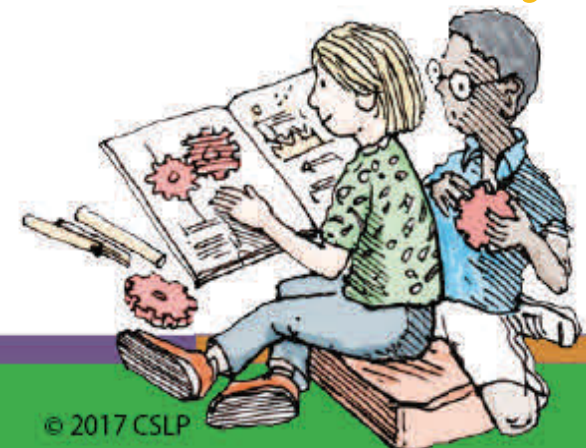
When your child has read the required minutes, he/she can come into the library to get the prize of the week.

Preschool & Kindergarten

Parents are asked to read to their children for 15 minutes a day, 5 days per week.

Once your child has registered for the program, you may register the minutes read by going online to your child's record and/or by adding the appropriate number of stickers to his or her timed reading record.



Grades 1-4

Students read for 20 minutes a day, 5 days per week.

Once your child has registered for the program, he or she can go online to enter minutes read, where the total will be automatically tallied, and/or add stickers to the timed reading record.

Minutes read in all school age groups will count for both Brainerd's Program and the Governor's Summer Reading Challenge.

Grades 5-8

Students read for 30 minutes a day, 5 days per week.

Once your child has registered for the program, he or she can go online to enter minutes read, where the total will be automatically tallied, and/or add stickers to the timed reading record.
